



Current SCNCA Official Fees

Officials fees for the Southern California / Nevada Cycling Association (SCNCA)

Officials fees are based on:

1. Permit type (National or Local; Local fees are listed below)
2. Length of day. Hours are calculated from opening of onsite registration, until after the awarding of prizes for the final event of the day.
3. Meeting day (example: Stage Races, Multi-day Track events) Under 4 hours.

Hourly rate (rounded up) for the first 10 hours.

Overtime payable at time + one half after 10 hours (in 15 n=minute increments)

3. Position assigned.
 1. Chief Referee \$21 per hour
 2. Chief Judge \$19 per hour
 3. Secretary \$19 per hour (camera & secretary are usually one person)
 4. Camera \$19 per hour (camera & secretary are usually one person)
 5. Assistant Referee \$18 per hour
 6. Assistant Judge \$18 per hour
 7. Motor Referee \$18 per hour
4. Mileage. Mileage is paid at IRS rate as of January 1 of each calendar year.
 1. \$0.655 / mile for round trip mileage to event
 2. \$0.655 / mile for any mileage incurred within the event. (example: Motor Referee)
 3. All Officials are paid by the Promoter at the completion of the race day.



Current SCNCA Official Fees

In addition to these fees, other special accommodations apply:

1. Meals. Meals and beverages/water are furnished to all officials during the course of the race day in events lasting longer than 6 hours.
 1. Single day events. If no meal is provided, a \$15.00 per diem will be added to each Officials' invoice.
 2. Multi-day events. If 2 meals are not provided, a \$35.00 per diem, per day, will be added to each Officials' invoice.
2. Lodging. Lodging will be provided to officials traveling from out of the immediate area, or distances greater than 100 miles, especially in instances of early morning race starts, multi-day events or the use of Motor Referees with mileages over the 100 mile limit.
3. Airfare. If airfare is less expensive than round trip event mileage, airfare is a reasonable option.
4. Parking. Long term parking fees.
5. Tolls.

These added costs will be communicated to you by the Chief Referee that has been assigned to your event.

A copy of the estimated Officials fees should be forwarded to you by your Chief Referee prior to your event. Invoice amounts may change in relation to changes in hours worked, any incurred overtime or mileage adjustments.
