

Many of you know me as "Genghis" Hahn. I began racing in the late 80's in NorCal during law school, and began racing here in SoCal in 1990. I have been involved with local clubs and fully sponsored teams (including the infamous Labor Power). I was a pretty good Cat 2, and am a four-time Masters National Champion, and multi-state champion. I like road races, crits, and even the occasional time trial. I've competed in BMX, mountain biking, and track. In short, I have seen it all.

I do not have any personal agenda. What I do have is a passion for bike racing. I have served on the Board for the past two years and want to continue to contribute my experience and strengths toward helping the SCNCA get organized to foster and grow a well-rounded, robust racing program here in SoCal (and Nevada).

Create an exciting race calendar that promotes development and performance by coordinating with the various SoCal promoters, and with NCNCA to develop unified state championships.

Continue to grow Southern California as the hot bed for the best racers in the country, and for sending elite racers to Europe.
